


Resident Population Keeps Increasing

Supply still hasn't recovered to pre-2008 recession levels




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
HOUSING MARKET OVERVIEW

We are in a housing crisis, not just an affordable housing crisis

Household incomes cannot keep up with increasing home prices



Housing Within DeKalb: It's Complicated

- Strong occupancy countywide: 335,512 housing units with 9% vacancy
- Value proposition for homeownership compared to the metro region
- Increasing population indicates high desirability

- Aging housing stock: 57% of units built before 1990
- 39% of households are cost burdened
- County-level median income < metro median income by +/- 29%
