

# **Engaging and aligning for better affordable housing outcomes**

2018	<b>Foundation launched GoATL</b> to demonstrate how impact investing can help fill key gaps in funding, 40% of investments in affordable housing
	Creation of HouseATL and blueprint for action
2019	HouseATL Funders' Collective established to align and better leverage capital (public, private, philanthropic and impact)
2020	Atlanta Affordable Housing Fund (AAHF) as first local housing impact fund, established to engage private impact capital and development expertise
2021	Community Foundation launches new strategic plan with housing and neighborhoods as key pillar for systems change and place-based investment
2022	Foundation brings together GoATL, HouseATL and AAHF in shared and aligned platform; Formation of the TogetherATL Affordable Housing Philanthropic Fund Launch of WORTH Initiative to address the root causes of the racial homeownership gap
2023	GoATL & TogetherATL Affordable Housing Funds (\$200 million) launch for greater scale and impact

**GOATL & TogetherATL Affordable Housing Funds (\$200 million) launch** for greater scale and impact to address need. Robert W. Woodruff and Whitehead Foundations make \$100 million commitment to funds.



### **Funding opportunities in and across three areas**

#### Funding partners may address affordability at varying scales of investment



System change requires continuous involvement from government at all levels and small grants to policy-focuses organizations can result in transformative change

#### **Opportunities**

Working with partners such as HouseATL, which convenes organizations involved in housing policy, to understand how you can help advance the work



From residential-based afterschool programs to initiatives focused on promoting homeownership, **dedicated programming to serve people and families on housing needs is critical** 

#### **Opportunities**

Partnering with organizations on programs and initiatives ranging from emergency rental assistance to keep families safely housing to helping close the racial homeownership gap.



Solving the rapidly growing housing needs in Atlanta relies on a collaborative solution leveraging private, public, and philanthropic partners to produce significantly more affordable housing

#### **Opportunities**

Direct investment in deals through the HouseATL Funders' Collective and in a pooled fund (co-investment) through the GoATL Affordable Housing Fund.



# Public, private, philanthropic funds for affordable housing: \$300M

#### **\$100M** City Housing Opportunity Bond

- In addition to Beloved Community Housing Trust Fund, estimate \$7M - \$14M in grant funds annually.
- Focused on public land, preservation, faith-based initiative, among other priorities.
- Opportunity for streamlined application and coordination with other funding sources

\$100M GoATL Affordable Housing Impact Fund

- Estimated 35 loans 7+ years, upside to impact through recycling of funds
- Commitment to gap funding
- Targeted opportunities with preservation and publicly-owned land
- First close projected in fall of 2023

\$100M TogetherATL Philanthropic Fund

- With and through non-profit development partners
- Long-term affordability 'land fund' with an estimated 20 conditional loans over 5-7 years
- 10% of funding for permanent supportive housing
- Targeted guarantees and grants to support non-profit capacity, pipeline and land activation






### Who We Are


The MicroLife Institute is a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization based in Atlanta, GA.


